About the Community

Coventry, (Population 12,500), the birthplace of Nathan Hale, is a rural/suburban community located approximately 22 miles east of Hartford, the state capital. The town is comprised primarily of single family homes, but there are also several working farms. The Coventry Public School system consists of one grammar school (K-2), one intermediate school (3-5), one middle school (6-8) and one high school (9-12).

About the School

Coventry High School serves approximately 524 students in grades 9-12. The mission of Coventry High School is to provide a safe, supportive, and challenging learning environment where students can develop the attributes of mind, body, and character necessary for success in their academic, professional, and personal lives. As a partnership of staff, students, families, and the community, Coventry High School strives to nurture responsible, independent learners, who think critically, respect diversity, and respond to the demands of an increasingly technological, multicultural, and interdependent global society.

About the Curriculum

Coventry High School offers an extensive variety of programs and courses designed to challenge its student population and maintain a high level of professional competence among faculty. Levels of study can vary to meet student needs and include Advanced Placement (AP), Honors, College Preparatory and Basic College Preparatory. Students can also enroll in cooperative programs with local colleges and universities, including the University of Connecticut (ECE), Eastern Connecticut State University and Manchester Community College. A wide variety of Virtual Learning Courses (VHS) are also available to our students. Another option for students is to take an Independent Study Course under the supervision of a faculty instructor. Parents and students are encouraged to explore other educational opportunities that are offered in the school district locally and regionally. These options may include magnet, charter and vocational-technical schools; Open Choice and inter-district programs; and vocational agriculture centers. All students are encouraged to maintain an individually rigorous program.
